ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONDUCT A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) PROCESS FOR THE PROCESSING OF CURBSIDE RECYCLABLES IN THE CITY OF MARION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The City of Marion currently operates a curbside recycling program for the residents of the City of Marion, and

WHEREAS, The collection occurs 5 days a week and generates approximately 775 tons of recyclable material annually, and

WHEREAS, The City of Marion as notified the processing facility that accepted the City of Marion recyclable material will no longer be accepting the material unless a processing charge is paid.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Marion, Ohio: Marion County,

Section 1. Based upon the information provided by the Director of Public Works, Council desires to conduct a Request for Proposal (RFP) process for the processing of recyclable material that is collected by the City of Marion's curbside recycle program,

Section 2. Currently the City does not pay a fee for the processing of recyclables and if a cost is incurred the Director of Public Works has the authority to cease the curbside recycling program,

Section 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the welfare of the City of Marion and its inhabitants thereof: Due to the processing of the recyclables will be ceased by the current facility at the end of the 2018; and as such shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise it shall become effective from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE STATE OF OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION FOR A CAPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT GRANT FOR CLEANING OF THE COLONIAL AVENUE SWALE AND RELATED REPAIRS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, during the committee meeting on September 18th the Chairman presented materials just handed to him from Marion Township Road Foreman Brown who gave all those present a first presentation of the joint application to pursue grant funding with a required match, and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of the project costs in the program;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Marion, Marion County, Ohio,

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the City of Marion with the State of Ohio Public Works Commission to aid in the financing of capital infrastructure projects in a collaborative effort with Marion Township.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor is authorized to furnish such additional information as the Ohio Public Works Commission may require in connection with the application for the program of projects submitted to OPWC.

SECTION 3. That the Mayor is authorized to execute grant agreements on behalf of the City of Marion with the State of Ohio Public Works Commission for aid in the financing of operating and capital assistance projects. Finally, the necessary match shall be paid from the _____.

SECTION 4. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare and safety of the City of Marion and the inhabitants thereof, and as such shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council; otherwise it shall become effective from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 23, 2018 AS NATIONAL GEAR UP WEEK IN THE CITY OF MARION

WHEREAS, GEAR UP is built around public-private partnerships, enlisting the formidable resources of government, business, and community groups to support low-income students as they prepare to enter and succeed in college; and

WHEREAS, GEAR UP at Marion City Schools is a partnership of the United Way of Marion County and The Ohio State University at Marion; and

WHEREAS, GEAR UP at Marion City Schools serves one thousand nine hundred sixty seven (1,967) students in grades seven through twelve; and

WHEREAS, the week of September 23, 2018 has been declared National GEAR UP Week; and

WHEREAS, Marion is committed to providing a quality education for all students, helping them to achieve their highest potential:

NOW, THEREFORE, we the City Council of Marion, Ohio do hereby recognize the week of September 23, 2018, as National GEAR UP Week in the City of Marion and we urge all citizens to join us in this special observance.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT AND REASONABLE EXPECTATION OF THE CITY OF MARION ON BEHALF OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE BORROWER) TO REIMBURSE ITS STORM AND SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT FUNDS FOR THE SHARPLESS COURT SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT, WITH THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT DEBT OF THE STATE OF OHIO.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Marion on behalf of the State of Ohio that:

- Section 1. The City of Marion reasonably expects to receive a reimbursement for the project named Sharpless Court Sewer Replacement Project, CP13V as set forth in Appendix A of the Project Agreement with the proceeds of bonds to be issued by the State of Ohio.
- Section 2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds, other than for costs of issuance, expected to be issued by the State of Ohio for reimbursement to the local subdivision is \$300,000.00.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT AND REASONABLE EXPECTATION OF THE CITY OF MARION ON BEHALF OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE BORROWER) TO REIMBURSE ITS STORM AND SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT FUNDS FOR THE FARMING STREET SEWER REPLACEMENT PROJECT, WITH THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT DEBT OF THE STATE OF OHIO.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Marion on behalf of the State of Ohio that:

Section 1. The City of Marion reasonably expects to receive a reimbursement for the project named Farming Street Sewer Replacement Project, CP15V as set forth in Appendix A of the Project Agreement with the proceeds of bonds to be issued by the State of Ohio.

Section 2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds, other than for costs of issuance, expected to be issued by the State of Ohio for reimbursement to the local subdivision is \$225,000.00.
