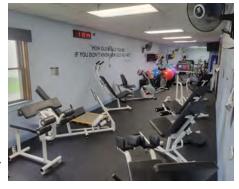




Fitness Center

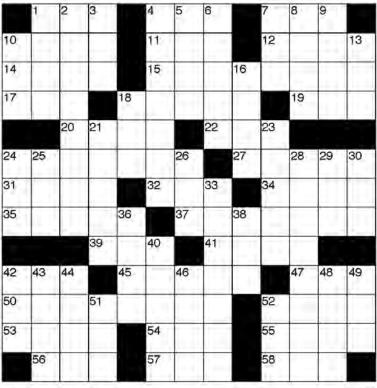
