

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY DIRECTOR ON BEHALF OF THE MARION POLICE DEPARTMENT TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT WITH MARION COUNTY TO UPGRADE THE CURRENT RECORDS MANAGEMENT AND MOBILE CAD SYSTEM FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Marion Police Department currently has CentralSquare ONESolution for records management and the mobile CAD system since 2009;

WHEREAS, CentralSquare purchased the previous vendor for ONESolution (Superion) and has decided that ONESolution is not the base platform they will use for the future;

WHEREAS, the Marion County Commissioners have passed a resolution to pay for the entire \$656,1865-year project upfront;

WHEREAS, the Marion Police Department's portion of the 5-year cost is \$50,122.20/year;

WHEREAS, the Marion County Commissioners have agreed to enter into agreement with the Marion Police Department to pay Marion County directly for \$50,122.20/year.

WHEREAS, the Marion Police Department budgeted approximately \$78,000 for annual maintenance costs for the 2022 year as that was the previous cost of annual maintenance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Marion, Marion County, Ohio;

Section 1. The Council hereby authorizes the Safety Director on behalf of the Marion Police Department to enter into agreement with Marion County to enable necessary upgrades and systems at the fixed rate of \$50,122.20/year for the next five years.

Section 2. The Council hereby authorizes the Marion Police Department to use the funds already budgeted in the 2022 police department budget in Contract Services for records management and mobile CAD to be used to pay the agreement with Marion County for the first year.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of health, welfare and safety of the City of Marion and the inhabitants thereof and for the further reason it is necessary for the daily operation of said City, given the immediate need to ensure the provision of vital services; and shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval of the Mayor, provided it received the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council; otherwise, it shall become effective from and after the earliest period allowed my law.
