

RESOLUTION URGING GOVERNOR DEWINE, THE OHIO SENATE, AND THE OHIO HOUSE TO OPPOSE THE PASSING OF HOUSE BILL 157, PROVIDING REFUNDS TO PEOPLE THAT WORKED AT HOME DURING COVID 19 PANDEMIC AND NOT PAYING MUNICIPAL TAXES TO THEIR NORMAL WORK LOCATION.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio passed House Bill 5 in 2016 and established consistency and guidelines to Municipalities on tax collection, and

WHEREAS, Municipalities have based their budgets and revenue collections on House Bill 5 guidelines, and

WHEREAS, Municipalities have faced loss revenues, uncertainty, and additional expenditures from the COVID 19 pandemic, and

WHEREAS, House Bill 157 adds an unnecessary layer of loss revenue, uncertainty and additional expenditures to Municipalities across the State of Ohio, and

WHEREAS, The workers would not have a job if it was not for the business that is located within the City's limits

WHEREAS, The cost to provide services does not go down just because the employees are working from home and not in the office,

BE IT RESOLVED, The City Council of the City of Marion formally requests Ohio Governor Mike DeWine, The Ohio Senate, and the Ohio House of Representatives to vote against House Bill 157 allowing refunds to employees that work from home instead their normal work location.
