ORDINANCE DESIGNATING DEPOSITORIES OF PUBLIC MONEYS OF THE CITY OF MARION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, applications have been received from eligible institutions to serve as depositories of the public moneys of the City of Marion, which applications are presently on file with this City and in the office of the City Treasurer thereof and which are hereby incorporated herein by reference, and it is therefore essential that action be taken on such applications as in this ordinance provided:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Marion, Marion County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the applications to serve as depositories of the active moneys of this City which have been received from the financial institutions referred to below, all of which are hereby determined to be eligible institutions for the deposit of such moneys, are hereby found to be in conformity with law, including Chapter 135 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the following financial institutions are hereby designated as public depositories of the active moneys under the control of this City for the period from September 14, 2018, to and including September 13, 2022, provided, however, that none of such institutions shall be permitted to receive and have on deposit at any one time a greater amount of active deposits of moneys of this City than that specified in its application for the same. That, on the basis of the operating needs of this City, the first \$25,000.00 of such moneys subject to the control of this City shall, in accordance with Section 135.04 of the Ohio Revised Code, be deposited in the Fahey Banking Co. and that the active moneys of this City in excess of such sum of \$25,000.00 shall be deposited in such institutions in proportion to their respective award quotas as determined pursuant to such Section 135.04. Said institutions and the amount of deposit in each are as follows:
