ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE SERVICE DIRECTOR
AMEND THE MASTER TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN BY
MODIFYING THE EXISTING 2 - WAY STOP TO A 4 - WAY
STOP AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF WOODROW AND
UNCAPHER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Traffic Commission met on May 6, 2019, and

WHEREAS, after due consideration of the material available to it the Traffic Commission voted 3-2 to recommend Council amend the City's Traffic Control Map by replacing the existing 2-way stop with a 4-way stop intersection,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Marion, Marion County, Ohio:

SECTION 1. Based upon the report of the City Engineer and upon the recommendation of the City's Traffic Commission, the Council hereby determines it necessary to amend the City's Traffic Control Map in regard to the intersection of Woodrow and Uncapher and replace same with a 4-way stop intersection.

Therefore, the Service Director is directed to place the stop signs at said intersection upon a schedule which he shall establish to provide notification of the impending change to provide for a safe and managed transition.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the welfare of the City of Marion and its' inhabitants thereof: Due to the real and present need to move forward without delay given the imminent School season and urgent need to move without delay; and as such shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise it shall become effective from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE MAKING ADDITIONAL AN APPROPRIATION IN THE MUNICIPAL COURT TRANSFER OUT LINE ITEM FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2019 GIVEN THE AGREED RESOLUTION ACHIEVED AFTER MEDIATION AT THE SUPREME COURT OF OHIO.

Whereas, the dispute regarding the additional appropriation was resolved by the agreement of the parties after the successful mediation conducted by the Supreme Court of Ohio and the authorized representatives of City Government and there is a real and present need to act in accordance therewith.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Marion, Marion County, Ohio:

Section 1. That there be additional appropriations as follows:

General Fund

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To be deposited in to said Fund's line item by the City Auditor according to the schedule contained on the executed Agreement item # 2 contained within Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof as if fully re-stated herein.

Mediation Agreement

- 1. The court, through its Judge, shall fully cooperate and take all actions necessary to seek reimbursement for the City of Marion, Ohio for the County's statutory obligation as to health care benefits including HSA and dental for all the years the request had not been made as part of the County's budget planning process. These actions will include but not be limited to issuance of a legally appropriate order directing the County Commissioners to reimburse the City.
- 2. Without regard to the success of the efforts described in Para. 1, twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22000) shall be advanced to the appropriate fund within the court by: June 30, 2019; August 31, 2019; October 31, 2019, and December 1, 2019.
- 3. The parties agree the above terms were the result of both parties participating in the Supreme Court's mediation program and collectively reaching agreement as to all issues pending before the Court.
